DONNING AND DOFFING INSTRUCTIONS







Locate the back of the gown, with the print facing the user.

Break the perforation line below each sleeve to separate the sleeves from the body of the gown.





Open the gown from the bottom, and insert hands into the sleeves.

Push thumbs and fingers through the perforated openings at the end of each sleeve.





Gather the gown together at the neck opening and slip the entire gown over the head.

Wrap the extra body material to the back side and tie or use an adequate amount of tape to secure.



For easy removal, tear along the vertical perforation line on the back. Doff the gown per CDC guidelines.
